Truits the littly gives advice on how to make your porch low vision friendly for trick or treat!

- Lightitup! Make sure there's directed lighting from street to porch.
- <u>Use reflective tape</u> on stairs and railings to highlight areas that can be in shadow.
- <u>Remove clutter</u> and clear an area to the door. Watch for twigs, leaves and junk that can blow around and become a hazard.
- <u>Reduce distracting noises.</u> Spooky sounds can be fun, but can also cause distractions for kids with low vision, making it hard to concentrate on seeing.

Never scare a child by jumping out at them. Kids with low vision can be startled easily causing them to fall.

Be thoughtful. If you're leaving a bowl for kids to choose on their own, don't leave it on the ground. Put it up on a table and label it with large print with contrasting colors.

• Remove welcome mats or secure them to the floor.





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
